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Networking Conference in the Process of Establishing a German-Israeli Youth Office

For Educators and Representatives from Youth Exchange, School Partnerships,

November 23–27, 2025 | Berlin

German-Israeli (youth) exchange cooperations have been facing difficult times:
After October 7 encounters could hardly take place. Challenging obstacles of logistics and security issues blocked perspectives for planning ahead. Yet, many partnerships have been in close connection. They wish to maintain the cooperation, which was meaningful and important to them all these years. Therefore a considerable number of partnerships succeeded in implementing encounters with groups of young adults or professionals in youth work in Germany. Others chose creative online meet-ups in order to bring young participants together anyhow.

ConAct – Coordination Center German-Israeli Youth Exchange and the Israel Youth Exchange Authority wish to open up the opportunity for exchange partnerships once again to keep in touch NOW. The Networking Conference in November 2025 shall offer a space to listen to one another and to ask questions on current developments in education and society in Israel and Germany. It shall open a space to connect and plan, and to look ahead for better times and exchange projects in 2026.

The Networking Conference 2025 signifies a further step to enhance the network of German-Israeli Youth contacts on the way of establishing a German-Israeli youth office. Therefore representatives and engaged educators of the different exchange formats of youth exchange, school partnerships, vocational trainings and volunteer services are invited to take part in this conference. The central idea is to strengthen existing and create new cooperations – YOU are welcome to join in!

- :: **address key issues** such as commemorating after October 7, combating antisemitism and fostering social cohesion in times of crisis
- :: **exchange experiences** on German-Israeli cooperation in times of war and instability – and its impact on encounters and volunteer services
- :: **discuss educational approaches** of working with young people on trauma and frightening life realities by strengthening resilience and offering empowerment
- :: **explore current barriers** of bilateral exchange & volunteering and find supportive strategies to overcome them
- :: **experience Berlin** together through guided visits and cultural events
- :: **celebrate 70 years** of German-Israeli youth exchange
- :: **find time, space and inspiration** to plan projects together for 2026 and beyond



Anonymous Question Method To Talk About Sensitive Topics After October 7

(Room: Tessin 1)

Since the Hamas attack on Israel on the 7th of October 2023 the effects have also been felt in Youth exchanges. There is a great uncertainty due to political developments in Israel and Germany. What can you say without being stigmatized? What questions can you ask without hurting your partner? In our last youth exchange in Autumn 2025, we used a method inspired by an Israeli TV show, allowing participants to ask questions anonymously. We invite you to experience this approach and engage in a discussion during our workshop.

Inviting organisations:

ConAct – Coordination Center for German-Israeli Youth Exchange is the nationwide service and information center for the promotion, support, and further development of German-Israeli youth contacts. ConAct provides financial and educational support to around 300 projects with approximately 7,000 participants in extracurricular education and exchange work each year, builds networks, and establishes new exchange partnerships between Germany and Israel. Since 2019, ConAct has been entrusted with developing projects in the process of establishing a German-Israeli Youth Organization. ConAct is an institution of the Federal Ministry of Education, Family, Seniors, Women, and Youth with the support of the states of Saxony-Anhalt and Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania.



The Israel Youth Exchange Authority (IYEA) is the coordinating office in Israel and the partner organization of ConAct–Coordination Center for German-Israeli Youth Exchange. On December 31st 1972, the Israeli government recommended to establish the formation of a non-profit public organization, consisting of approximately 80 representatives of different active organizations in the field of youth and young adults, in order to promote and coordinate youth exchanges between Israel and Germany. The exchanges are carried out by the organizations with the Authority's support. The Authority operates in collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Education.



In cooperation with:

German-Israeli Programme on Cooperation in Vocational Education and Training enables apprentices, specialists and managers to take part in cross-border learning and practical placements, promotes innovative approaches in collaboration with educational institutions and strengthens the international networking of vocational education and training systems. As part of the German-Israeli educational landscape, the German-Israeli Programme is aimed specifically at vocational training institutions that are committed to exchange, qualification and cooperation.



The German-Israeli Volunteer Service is a program of the **Central Welfare Board of Jews in Germany e. V.** and was established 2015. It is aimed at young people between the ages of 18 and 26 with German or Israeli citizenship or permanent residence in one of the two countries. It is not affiliated with any particular religious denomination. In Germany, Israeli volunteers work in social institutions and in formal and informal educational projects. In Israel, German volunteers work in institutions for people with disabilities, rehabilitation centers, and in senior care.



The Educational Exchange Service of the Secretariat of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs promotes European and international exchange in the field of education. It operates on behalf of the federal states and is based in Bonn. The Educational Exchange Service promotes school partnerships with Israel: schools can apply for subsidies to cover the flight and program costs of Israeli student groups and accompanying teachers for their stay at the German partner school. Preparatory visits are also funded.





Caravan Orchestra & Choir Sounds of Diversity from Haifa and Weimar

The Caravan Orchestra & Choir was founded in the summer of 2017 as an exchange project between Yiddish Summer Weimar and the Department of Music at the University of Haifa, in cooperation with the University of Music FRANZ LISZT Weimar.

Each year, the Orchestra invites young artists from Israel and Germany to participate in a 2–3 week residency in Haifa and Weimar. The program includes an intensive rehearsal period, concerts in both countries, and a variety of social activities, workshops, and excursions.

Guided by internationally acclaimed musicians, the Caravan Orchestra & Choir celebrates a centuries-old musical dialogue among Yiddish, Arabic, Sephardic, Ottoman, and Greco-Turkish traditions. Together, the young musicians discover that these sounds form not just history—but a living, shared heritage that inspires new creativity and connection.

Winners of the 2018 Shimon Peres Prize, the Caravan Orchestra & Choir is always a new adventure—creating exuberant, passionate music that is fresh, full of improvisation, and pure joy. Come and discover what they will bring to the stage on Monday night!
